Currently the intersection of Date Street and P Street does not have a 4 way stop sign and only stops signs on the Date Street portion. Due to this, there are multiple vehicles that speed down the street at speeds over 35 MPH. I have requested the city to add a 4 way stop sign before but that request has never been completed.

Today (12/30/2022) I saw another vehicle speeding down the street causing an accident and damaging city property. Where the city sewer station is located. 2 years prior my personal vehicle had been hit while parked on the side of the road due to reckless driving. I have also seen many near misses involving children.

The biggest issue is that the intersection also has a portion of Date Street park where children play. I have lived at my address for over 31 years and I have watched children riding bikes, speed down the walking path adjacent to my house and then into the street. Due to large foliage on the south side on the park and my house fence on the north side someone could easy miss a child speeding down the path. Since the kids like coming into the street. Some one could accidently hit these children playing.
