# HEAD LIFEGUARD

Class specifications are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in the class. Specifications are <u>not</u> intended to reflect all duties performed within the job.

# DEFINITION

Under supervision of the Parks and Recreation Director, to supervise the day-to-day activities of the City's Community Pool; and to do other related work as required.

# CLASS CHARACTERISTICS

The Head Life Guard is responsible to supervise the day-to-day activities oft the City Pool Program, including life guards, water safety, and other activities. The position is seasonal, and salary is based on an hourly Salary-Band which allows the incumbent to move up to Control Point C based on experience with the City of Live Oak as a Life Guard, performance, and life guard certifications and/or special training.

# EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

The following duties are typical for this classification. Incumbents may not perform all of the listed duties and/or may be required to perform additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.

- 1. Supervise facility and lifeguards and promote water safety at Live Oak's Community Pool;
- 2. Assist the Parks and Recreation Director in the supervision and operation of the City of Live Oak's Community Pool to meet the needs of the community;
- 3. Monitors all activities at the pool with regard to the public and staff;
- 4. Provide direction and supervision to pool staff including training in water safety;
- 5. Ensure a safe, clean and well-maintained facility;
- 6. Enforce all beach/pool policies in a consistent, professional manner;
- 7. Complete facility safety checks and reports as required.

# MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education/Experience: Candidates for the Head Lifeguard/Lesson Supervisor position must be a minimum of 18 years of age; three years experience life guarding; Head Lifeguard Certification preferred; possession of CPR for the Professional Rescuer and First Aid Certifications; Water Safety Instructor (WSI) certified; good decision making skills; ability to pass background investigation; ability to work with limited supervision; ability to work cooperatively with City staff and the public; Supervisory experience in Aquatics or other related field preferred.

# **POSITION DETAILS**

The Chief Lifeguard schedule is typically part-time 15-20 hours per week with flexibility to work 30 to 40 hours per week. This position is a temporary position and is not eligible to participate in the City benefit programs.
